CONFESSION OF SIN & ASSURANCE

The Heidelberg Catechism is a teaching tool, taking the form of a series of questions and answers, to instruct people in the basics of the Christian faith. It was written in 1563 at the request of Frederick III who ruled the Palatinate, an influential German Province. The catechism based each of its statements on the text of the Bible. It has been translated into many languages and is one of the most widely used catechisms of the Reformation period.

Leader: How do you come to know your misery?

People: The law of God tells me.¹

Leader: What does God's law require of us?

People: Christ teaches us this in summary in Matthew 22— Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength.¹ This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: Love your neighbor as yourself.² All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments.
